Amid the revolution's advance, Marie struggles to support Louis's rule. When he succumbs to depression, she steps up to rule in his place.

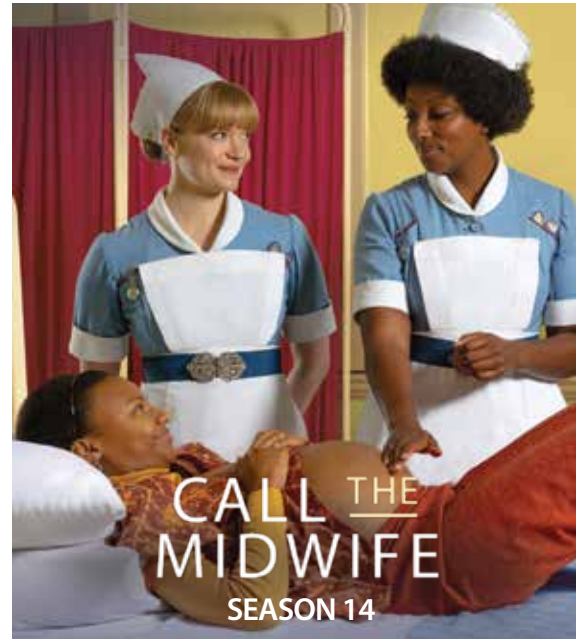

Travel with host, Mexico City Philharmonic chief conductor Scott Yoo, in this special mini-series taking viewers on a voyage of musical discovery for aficionados and neophytes alike. Each episode reveals the creative process behind a diverse range of classical music in both historic and modern-day periods.

April 11– Chopin's Polish Heart

Chopin was born in Poland and lived there until age 20, when war broke out. Seeking safety and inspiration, he found a new home in Paris... though he longed for his old one. Scott and Polish-Canadian pianist Jan Lisiecki explore the folk music of Poland and the Romantic-era artists and musicians of Paris, Chopin's diverging inspirations. He stayed in France until his untimely death. But his heart always was in Poland.

April 18 - Boccherini: Night Music

The Spanish court brought Boccherini, Europe's greatest cellist, from Italy to Spain. There he created new musical forms and fell in love with his adopted hometown -- until he was exiled to the Sierra. He promptly wrote a love letter to his city, Night Music of the Streets of Madrid, which became his most popular composition. Scott and four great young players take an all night walking tour of Madrid's current night music, to better understand Boccherini's inspiration.

April 25 – Rachmaninoff Reborn

Rachmaninoff was a Russian aristocrat who lost everything in the Bolshevik revolution: his home, his family fortune, his musical inspiration. Adrift in a new landscape, speaking little English, he longed for a homeland that had disappeared. So at 44, to support his family, he changed careers and charted a new path. He embraced modern technology, toured relentlessly, and reinvented himself as a modern American artist.

CHANGING PLANET

Premieres April 17 at 11pm

The series revisits some of our planet's most vulnerable ecosystems and provide updates on how communities are working to develop resilience in the face of climate change. The series travels from Brazil to California, Greenland to the Maldives, Kenya to Cambodia to chart how inspiring individuals and communities are making progress — and facing setbacks — over the last 12 months.

"We have an opportunity to do things properly," said host Dr. M. Sanjayan. "We have the inherited wisdom, we have the science, and we have the tech to understand when things are going wrong and why. Now we need the money and political muscle to implement what needs doing."

In Hour 1, Sanjayan hosts from Australia, a country on the frontline of climate change, both in terms of its devastating effects but also possible solutions. He travels to the remote Gibson Desert, where the land is under the stewardship of the Indigenous Pintupi, who are having spectacular success preserving a vast and vital ecosystem. Sanjayan learns about cultural burning and how small managed fires guard against megafires and invigorate the landscape with new plant growth.

Megafires are also a problem in Northern California and CHANGING PLANET reports on traditional burning practices that mitigate these risks by visiting the Tule, Mono and Yurok tribes. Other efforts to create a fire-resistant landscape include reintroducing the beaver, a native keystone species. The beaver's natural damming activities restore creeks and rivers and function like speedbumps for forest fires, changing how fire moves through the landscape.

The program also examines the heroic efforts being made to support the nearly extinct Siamese crocodile in Cambodia; follows researchers tracking musk oxen in Greenland to learn more about how they are being affected by climate change; and travels to the Maldives where acoustic experts and ecologists use hydrophones to listen to the heartbeat of a coral reef.

May, 1536. Anne Boleyn, Henry's second wife, is dead. As the axe drops, Thomas Cromwell emerges from the bloodbath to continue his climb to power and wealth, while his formidable master, Henry, settles to short-lived happiness with his third queen, Jane Seymour.

Cromwell, a man with only his wits to rely on, has no great family to back him, and no private army. Navigating the moral complexities that accompany the exercise of power in this brutal and bloody time, Cromwell is caught between his desire to do what is right and his instinct to survive. But in the wake of Henry VIII having executed his queen, no one is safe.

Despite rebellion at home, traitors plotting abroad and the threat of invasion testing Henry's regime to breaking point, Cromwell's robust imagination sees a new country in the mirror of the future. All of England lies at his feet, ripe for innovation and religious reform. But as fortune's wheel turns, Cromwell's enemies are gathering in the shadows.

The inevitable question remains: how long can anyone survive under Henry's cruel and capricious gaze?

Eagerly awaited and years in the making, the Masterpiece series traces the final four years of Cromwell's life, completing his journey from self-made man to the most feared, influential figure of his time. Cromwell is as complex as he is unforgettable: a politician and a fixer, a diplomat and a father, a man who both defied and defined his age.

The birth of a prince comes at a terrible price and Cromwell must help the King remarry. With European politics in disarray, Cromwell sees a chance to form a new alliance.

Episode Five – Mirror – Sun, April 20 at 9pm
Cromwell brings Anne of Cleves to England to be Henry's new wife. With France and the Holy Roman Emperor together threatening to invade England, the marriage will cement an alliance between the powerful reforming princes of Europe and defend England from attack.

Episode Six – Light – Sun, April 27 at 9pm (Finale)
Fortune's wheel turns as Cromwell finally finds himself in Henry's crosshairs. Charged with treason and feeling the axe's edge, only a masterstroke of political maneuvering can save him from the scaffold now.
